# 81<sup>st</sup> Session of the Texas State Legislature

## -- February 2009 Legislative Update --

### **Eminent Domain**

HB4 (Orr); HB402 (Woolley); SB533 (Duncan); HB417 (Callegari); HJR14 (Corte); HJR31 (Anderson); SB219 (Nichols)

#### Similarities between the bills:

- Some of the bills include rules regarding condemnation proceedings for a “governmental entity” only. One such rule is a required record vote in a public meeting;
- All bills define offers as: one that is not arbitrary or capricious and is based on a reasonably thorough investigation and honest assessment of the amount compensation due to the landowner as a result of the taking;
- Repurchase similarities in the bills include establishing the repurchase price as the price paid to the owner by the entity at the time the property was condemned and a provision for repurchase if construction is nonexistent. HB 402 allows for repurchase of a property if, after a certain date, construction “has not begun”; whereas, HB 4 and SB 533 allows for repurchase if, after a certain time, there has not been “actual progress” in construction; and
- HB4 (Orr) and SB533 (Duncan) include reporting requirements for the Comptroller and the Texas Legislative Council.

#### Unique provisions:

- HB 402 (Woolley) changes the evidentiary standard used for determining market value, but does not include reporting requirements;
- HB417 (Callegari) redefines a ‘blighted area’ for eminent domain purposes such that every structure and lot must meet definition, instead of the ‘area’; and
- SB219 (Nichols) prohibits the use of eminent domain for parks and recreational uses.

**Statewide Smoking Ban**

HB5 (Crownover)

Prohibits smoking in all public places. Exceptions are:

- (1) A private residence, except when used as a child-care, adult day-care, or health care facility;
- (2) A hotel or motel room rented to a guest and designated as a smoking room, if:
  - (A) Not more than 20 percent of rooms rented to guests in a hotel or motel are designated as smoking rooms;
  - (B) All smoking rooms in the hotel or motel on the same floor are contiguous;
  - (C) Smoke from smoking rooms does not enter an area in which smoking is prohibited; and
  - (D) Non-smoking rooms are not converted to smoking rooms;
- (3) a private or semiprivate room in a nursing home or long-term care facility occupied by one or more persons, all of whom are smokers and have requested in writing to be placed in a room where smoking is permitted, provided that smoke from the room does not enter an area where smoking is prohibited;
- (4) A private club that does not employ any employees:
  - (A) Unless the club is being used for a function to which the general public is invited; and
  - (B) Provided the private club is not established for the sole purpose of avoiding compliance with this chapter; or
- (5) The outdoor area of a place of employment

The legislation preempts and supersedes a local ordinance of a municipality unless the local ordinance prohibits or restricts smoking to a greater degree than the prohibitions in the legislation.

### **Appraisal and Revenue Caps**

HB17 (Leibowitz); HB46 (Riddle); HB127 (Callegari); HB209 (Bohac); HJR12 (Leibowitz); HJR17 (Guillen); HJR21 (Callegari); HJR22 (Villarreal); SB218 (Nichols); SB276 (Patrick, D); SB299 (Patrick, D); SJR10 (Nichols); SJR13 (Patrick, D)

- Several bills have been filed which would lower the current 10% maximum that an appraisal can increase per year on real property.
- Other bills propose to lower the current rollback tax rate or exclude from the calculation currently permissible exceptions.
- Some of the bills allow the reductions to be imposed by the local governing body or by petition and voter referendum.
- Legislation will also be filed allowing a municipality to raise the sales tax in exchange for property tax reduction.

### **Mandated Education of Local Government Officials**

Legislation is expected to be introduced requiring local government education classes to be taken by local elected officials and certain city officials.

### **Towing and Tow Truck Legislation**

Legislation is expected to be introduced that will require the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation to set non-consent towing fees and preempt local fee-setting authority.

**Overtime Pay for Dallas Firefighters**

Legislation will be introduced that provides for the following:

. . . in a municipality with a population of one million or more that has not adopted Chapter 143, for purposes of determining hours worked, including determining hours worked for calculation of overtime under Subsection (e), all hours are counted as hours worked during which the fire fighter or member of the fire department:

- (1) Is required to remain available for immediate call to duty by continuously remaining in contact with the fire department office by telephone, pager, or radio; or
- (2) Is taking any authorized leave, including attendance incentive leave, vacation leave, holiday leave, sick leave, compensatory time off, jury duty, military leave, or leave because of a death in the family.
