# Periodic Inspection Report No. 9 Maintenance Deficiency Correction Period (MDCP) February 2011 Update

As of February 28, 2011, the City has completed **193** of the 198 items in the MDCP plan which is the action plan staff submitted to the US Corps of Engineers (Corps) to address the O&M deficiencies in the levee system as described in the Periodic Inspection Report No. 9 (PI #9).

The **two** items completed in February 2011 were items related to erosion at Bellview pressure sewer. The remaining **five** MDCP items will take several months to complete. This is because some of the items have complex issues which are being coordinated with the Corps and two of the items are related to the completion of the Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge project in the Trinity River. The five items are as follows:

- 1 item related to a plan to systematically inspect pipes, culverts or conduits in the levees the plan has been submitted to the Corps and will be removed from this list upon Corps' approval of the plan
- 1 item related to encroachment in the flood plain due to construction equipment for the Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge – this item will be addressed upon completion of the bridge construction
- 2 items related to locating or obtaining permits for multiple utility crossings at the Central Wastewater Treatment Plant Levee – the plans to address the multiple utility crossings have been submitted to the Corps and discussions on the resolution of the utility crossings are underway
- 1 item related to erosion will be addressed by the completion of the Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge

### SUBJECT Tree Removal on the Trinity River Levee System

The trees along the Trinity River in the Dallas Levee System were removed to comply with the Corps' 15-foot no vegetation zone. This was done to allow for flood fighting access and levee inspection, as well as improve the access to the levee system for operation and maintenance. According to the Corps standards, all trees and roots had to be removed to a point where no more than one half inch diameter roots are left in the soil. This was done to reduce the chances of seepage, as well as assist in maintaining the levee soil integrity in the event of a flood.

During the tree removal process, the City and contractor discovered in order to comply with the Corps requirements of root removal, the estimated excavation area was significantly smaller than that realized in the field. In order to ensure the integrity of the levee, backfill had to be done immediately and stabilized with lime after the roots were removed. This resulted in bringing in more lime to stabilize the disturbed soil and hydromulch to cover the additional disturbed areas during the tree removal and root chasing process.

The City agreed to bring in additional lime to stabilize the soil and additional hydromulch to ensure the integrity of the levees are not compromised. An agenda item to ratify the emergency work on the tree removal contract is going to be in the council agenda on March 9, 2011.

Ratify emergency work performed on an existing service contract with Young's General Contracting, Inc. for additional hydromulch and lime stabilization located within the specific buffer areas along the Trinity River Levee System - Not to exceed \$191,627 - Financing: Stormwater Drainage Management Funds

### **BACKGROUND**

Periodic Inspection #9 of the Dallas Floodway Levee System was performed in 2007 by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) and provided to the City in March 2009. The final results of the inspection were an unacceptable rating for the levee system. One of the major categories determined to be unacceptable involved trees growing within fifteen feet of the toe or base of the levee. To correct this deficiency, the removal areas were identified; plans and specifications detailing the proper method of removal were prepared and applied to the service contract.

These trees were removed to comply with the Corps' 15-foot no vegetation zone and other trees to allow for the flood fighting access and levee inspection. According to the Corps standards, all trees and roots had to be removed to a point where no more than one half inch diameter roots are left in the soil. This was done to reduce the changes of seepage, as well as assist in maintaining the levee soil integrity in the event of a flood.

During the tree removal process, the City and contractor found that in order to remove roots as required by the Corps, the excavation limits shown on the plans had to be expanded. In order to ensure the integrity of the levee, backfill had to be done immediately and stabilized after the roots were removed. This resulted in bringing in more lime to stabilize the disturbed soil and hydromulch to cover the additional disturbed areas during the tree removal and root chasing process. In addition, 7 trees were removed in the 15-foot no vegetation zone which were not in the original contract.

Authorized Supplemental Agreement No. 2 to the professional services contract with HNTB Corporation for engineering services to provide analysis, modeling, planning and design for the Dallas Flood Levee System Study in order to correct documented deficiencies from Periodic Inspection #9 on June 10, 2009, by Resolution No. 09-1498.

The Trinity River Corridor Project Committee was briefed by memo on August 17, 2010.

Authorized a construction services contract with Young's General Contracting, Inc. for the removal of trees located within the specific buffer areas along the Trinity River Levee System on September 8, 2010, by Resolution No. 10-2324.


