SUBJECT Able Pump Station and Sump Improvements Update

On April 13, 2011, the Dallas City Council authorized a supplement to the professional services contract with HDR Engineering Inc., to prepare construction plans and specifications for a new Able Pump Station and sump improvements.

On August 5, 2008, we briefed the location of the proposed new Able Pump Station to be next to the Bellevue Pressure Sewer. This supplemental agreement proposes the new Able Pump Station to be directly across the sump from the existing Able Pump Station, between the Houston Street and Jefferson Boulevard Viaducts (see attached map). The pump station was relocated to simplify the construction and reduce the costs of the connections within the ponds of Able sump, to simplify the routing of the discharge piping over the East Levee, and to improve the long term opportunities for economic development in the neighborhood. The design will be coordinated with other on-going projects in the Trinity Corridor including applicable components of the Balanced Vision Plan and the proposed Trinity Parkway.

The current schedule reflects completion of construction plans and specifications in the summer of 2012. Construction is estimated to take two years, upon start of construction. However, additional funding from a future bond program will be necessary to proceed to the construction phase.
