3. Dallas Police Crime Report

Presenter: Chief of Police David O. Brown, Dallas Police Department

Police Chief Brown provided the committee with a progress report of the Police Department in crime.

- Summer Drug Task Force
- Burglary Motor Vehicle

4. Dallas Police Bicycle Patrols

Presenter: Assistant Chief Tom Lawrence, Dallas Police Department

The purpose of this presentation is as follows:

- Review the history of the DPD Bicycle Patrol Program
- Discuss
 - Goals
 - Advantages and disadvantages
 - Equipment and costs
 - Current staffing
 - Future considerations

The historical background of this program is as follows:

- Began in 1991 as part of the Crime Prevention Unit
- Bicycles were donated by a North Dallas Community Group
- Trained by Seattle Police Department
- First used in East Dallas

Program goals are as follows:

- Increase Police Visibility
 - Downtown Dallas including Convention Center and Art's District
 - Entertainment Districts
 - High Crime Areas
 - Parks, Running and Bike trails
 - Special Events (i.e. parades and protests)
- Assist in Quality of Life Issues
 - The Bridge
 - Farmers Market Area

The committee had the following areas of concern:

- · What do officers do when they see crime while riding on the bike?
- What type of fitness training do officers get ready for bike patrol?
- Do officers volunteer for this job on bike patrol?
- Length of time on the bike in an 8 hour shift?
- What do officers do if they get a flat?
- Do the bikes have flashing red lights?
- Who decides where the bikes are deployed?
- · Plans for more bike officers, since more trails are opening?
- Number of certified bicycle rider's city wide?
- Number of bikes in entertainment areas?
- How three wheelers and Segway's are differ from the bicycles?
- Do the officers stop and interact with the businesses in their area?

5. Crime Scene Section Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) Enhancements

Presenter: Deputy Chief Sherryl Scott, Dallas Police Department

AFIS is a biometric solution that automates the processing of arrest and applicant fingerprint cards. Enables criminal justice agencies to search latent prints developed at crime scenes against the database.

The purpose of this presentation is as follows:

 - Advancements in Automated Fingerprint Identification Systems (AFIS)
 - State and Federal AFIS networks
 - New technology and databases including palm print records

AFIS goals are as follows:

- Provide timely intelligence to investigative personnel by:
 - Continuing to pursue new and innovative biometric technology
 - Expanding databases that contain valuable latent evidence

- Do civilian and sworn police personnel read prints?
- Is the iris different on everyone like finger prints?
- Length of time prints is stored?
- · Palm print records are stored and kept
- Facial recognition
