

# CRIME

## Goals

- Reduce Crime Rate for the tenth consecutive year
- Provide a flexible response to address dynamic crime trends
- Deploy uniformed and covert officers using real time intelligence
- Assist with call answering to help reduce response times

# Background

- Went live on December 5, 2012
- Leveraged resources from each patrol division in order to reduce crime in historical hotspots and throughout the city
- Developed to:
  - target Part 1 offense locations
  - focus on repeat offenders committing crimes and their behaviors using current actionable intelligence



# Strategies


- Real time deployment using uniformed and covert officers
- Critical fluid deployments
- Compliment detectives investigations and patrol response
- Disrupt ongoing criminal enterprises and chronic neighborhood issues

# Strategies

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- Provide intelligence to enhance communication and investigations
  - Daily and weekly analysis of crime and intelligence
  - Identify emerging crime trends and hot spots and monitor historic problem areas
  - **CONSTANT REAL-TIME ANALYSIS** and deployment based on intelligence gathered in aftermath of criminal activities

# Successes

- Lake Highland Rapist
- 20+ arrests for \$1.6 Million U.S. Secret Service Investigation for I.D. Theft in Dallas area
- 4 Capital Murder Arrests
- 8 Murder Arrests
- 95 Family Violence Arrests
- 51 Robbery Arrests
- 24 Sexual Assault of Adult/Child Arrests



# Activity December 5<sup>th</sup> – May 19<sup>th</sup>

- 2472 Calls answered
- 882 Felony Warrant Arrests
- 453 Misdemeanor Warrant Arrests
- 569 Felony/Misdemeanor In-The-Act Arrests
- 112 Stolen Vehicles Recovered
- 106 Guns Seized
- Crime Rate decreased citywide by 4.4% as of May 14, 2012

# Summary

- M.E.T.R.O. is unique squad consisting of both uniformed and covert officers that is responsive, highly adaptable and sustainable to disrupt and dismantle criminal enterprises
- M.E.T.R.O. compliments patrol and investigators by leveraging limited resources to get “most bang for the buck”
- M.E.T.R.O. networks with outside agencies to share intelligence and combat crime trends and transit offenders
