The Dallas Police Department is seeking approval to enter into an interlocal agreement with the Tarrant County District Attorney, the Anderson County District Attorney, Texas Office of the Attorney General, and Tarrant County Sheriff's Department for equitable sharing of asset seizures and forfeiture under Chapter 59 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedures.

The City will receive 20% of all money and assets forfeited from criminal and civil investigations related to Hest Technologies, Inc. and any of its principals, officers, subsidiaries, employees, representatives, associated entities, third parties doing business with Hest Technologies, Inc. generally styled In ReInvestigation of Hest Technologies Inc. The term of this agreement will be from the date executed by all parties until final distribution of all proceeds and property forfeited pursuant to the investigation and shall automatically end upon the completion of said distribution.

The City is seeking recommendation from the Public Safety Committee to authorize an interlocal agreement for equitable sharing of asset seizures and forfeitures. This item will be placed on the City Council Agenda on June 12, 2013.

SUBJECT: Authorize a Three-Year Master Agreement for Uniforms and Alterations Services

Upon completion of a formal competitive proposal process, the City seeks authorization to initiate a three-year master agreement for uniforms, and alterations totaling \$4,994,361 with the most responsive bidders ERMC/ASR in the amount of \$559,598, Premier/Sterling in the amount of \$238,571, Regali, Inc. in the amount of \$3,903,267 and C&N Wholesale in the amount of \$292,925.

The Dallas Police Department Quartermaster serves approximately 3,500 sworn officers, deputy marshals, parking enforcement officers and civilian employees. This three year agreement will provide buttons, insignia, patches, motorcycle and bike uniforms, rain and raid jackets, fatigues, civilian shirts, and alterations services for the Dallas Police Department and other City of Dallas Departments.

The City is seeking recommendation from the Public Safety Committee to authorize this master agreement for the purchase of uniforms and alterations. This item will be placed on the City Council Agenda on June 26, 2013.
