Narrative	The cause of this fire is undetermined. The extent of the damage that this structure received from both the fire itself and the water streams applied during extinguishment eliminated the possibility of identifying the "point of origin" and a reliable ignition source. The "area of origin" may be the rear of the structure as neighbors reported that the initial flames came from the C-side. The roof collapsed while the fire was being extinguished which made the building structurally unsafe for investigators to conduct a thorough investigation. The owner stated that three canines and two cats were among the pets that were left inside of the structure prior to the family leaving for a concert at approximately 5:00 PM before the incident. Engine 10 was the first responding company. Insurance information is unknown. This fire remains under investigation.

Narrative	This is an accidental fire that resulted from unattended cooking. Oil in a pan that overheated on the stove-top ignited which actuated the sprinkler system. The hot oil then boiled over when it mixed with the water from the sprinkler head. The victim, who was making an attempt to turn off the burner, received burns to her right hand and left foot as result. The victim was not transported but sought care at her primary care physician. The structure did not receive any damage; however, several content items received damage from the small fire. Engine 28 was the first responding company. Insurance information is unknown.
