2. Pride in Your Neighborhood Program

The briefing covered the program goals of re-establishing and nurturing community pride in seven neighborhoods as well as reducing litter, wiping out graffiti, eliminating common dump sites, attracting new stakeholders and increasing property values over time. Each neighborhood is slated for the following activities: 2 clean up events, 2 beautification events, 1 leadership workshop, home improvement incentive opportunities, joint Environmental program for youth and 1 neighborhood website. Three neighborhoods (Arcadia Park, Beverly Hills & Cedar Oaks) have already begun.

Next steps include continuing to roll out the remaining four neighborhoods, conduct program activities in all neighborhoods, identify and rank "Pride" neighborhoods to initiate in FY09 and provide a status update to the Quality of Life Committee in Spring 2009.

An accountability report card was created to track trends in key customer service requests in the seven service areas. The report card will be issued monthly to Council.		
For FY07-08 the following results have been performed: neighborhood based operations, neighborhood Code representatives were assigned and work directly with community groups, individuals and police, and significant reductions in key customer requests from FY06-07 through community-focused approach.
