QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT TO CITY OF DALLAS BOARDS

The Dallas City Code establishes certain qualifications that must be met by all members of city boards and commissions. In addition to any special qualifications for service on a particular board, a board member must:

- -- Have been a resident of Dallas for at least six months prior to the date of appointment.
- -- Be a qualified City of Dallas voter at the time of appointment.
- -- Have no criminal record that is considered by the city council to be so serious that it should serve as a disqualification.
- -- Not be an adversary party to pending litigation against the city.
- Not be an employee or a business associate of either an adversary party or a representative of an adversary party, nor have a pecuniary interest, in any pending litigation or claim, other than an eminent domain proceeding.
- -- Not be in arrears on any city taxes, water service charges or other obligations owed the city.
- -- Have a creditable record of attendance and performance in any previous board service.
